Shlomo Stern – Scientist in Cardiology (1)


- 1960s: **Start** with the Holter Monitoring Technique using the new ambulatory Holter Recorder produced by Bruce del Mar
- 1974: Landmark paper on silent myocardial ischemia detected by 24-h-Holter ECG monitoring (British Heart Journal)
- Research Topics:
 - Characteristics, clinical significance and prognostic value of silent ischemia
 - Developments in Holter monitoring
 - Correlation between life-threatening arrhythmias and myocardial ischemia
 - Silent myocardial ischemia during stress echocardiography
 - The effect of age on the cardiovascular system
- 2013: **Publications:** more than **250** in international Journals and numerous lectures worlwide until his death






Shlomo Stern – ISHNE Promoter (2)

- 1986: Main initiator and promoter of the International Society of Holter Monitoring (ISHM), (together with Harold Kennedy, Arthur Moss, Antonio Bayes-de Luna and Vinzenz Hombach)
- 1988: Founding of ISHM in Vienna
- 1988: First President of ISHM
- 1989: Editor-in-Chief of Journal of Ambulatory Monitoring (JAM) (first official Journal of ISHM)
- 1996: Co-Editor-in-Chief of the Annals of Noninvasive Electrocardiology (ANE) (official Journal of ISHNE)
- 1986-2013: Participated in all ISHNE International Congresses and in numerous Satellite Symposia of ISHNE worldwide and of almost all ISHNE-BOT-Meetings; constant thinking on ISHNE and new activities and goals of the Society; he relied on and always called for friendship among the ISHNE family as the main source of scientific and personal success

- 1990s: Organizing numerous Educational Sessions on behalf of ISHNE, together with Wojcech Zareba
- 1990s: Personal contacts and motivation of young scientists in electrocardiology to perform research and to become active members of ISHNE
- 1996: **Mentor and friend** of many young scientists by sending hundreds of letters encouraging them to send papers to the ANE
- 1996s: Shlomo published numerous educational papers and reviews on new developments in electrocardiography in ANE, particularly valuable for the young scientists
- 2013: Certificate of Recognition for his Contribution to ISHNE as Co-Editor-in-Chief of ANE
